

ABANDONED TREASURES: INGENIOUS RENOVATIONS

Key to discovering the energy of Bordeaux, these former abandoned sites have been renovated to highlight local treasures. Simply not to be missed!

The Darwin district, Bordeaux

15-minute drive from Le Saint-James

A renovated disused urban site located in the Bastide district, the Darwin Eco-System brings together organizations, artists and companies to focus on ecology and sustainable development. This alternative destination bubbles with energy and effervescence. Its slightly hipster vibe always makes it an exciting place to visit. You can even sample some truly local food and drink at the now renowned Magasin Général, a bistro/canteen/grocery store that roasts its own coffee and serves its own specially brewed beer. The Submarine Base, Bordeaux

20-minute drive from Le Saint-James

Situated in Bassins à Flots, Bordeaux's new hot spot, this gigantic bunker built by the Nazis in 1940 is now open to the public and is home to an exceptional 12,000 m2 cultural center. The program of temporary exhibits, concerts, plays and shows put on at this unusual site will draw you in while the works enhance and put a new spin on the location's past. Bages Village

This picturesque old wine-growing village has been restored, and is now home to an elegant vintage brasserie, a top-quality butcher's shop, a jovial high-end market that features delights such as wines from the Cazes family (Château Lynch-Bages, Château Ormes de Pez, Château Villa Bel-Air, Château Cordeillan-Bages and more), and a bike hire service so you can cycle along the marked routes. Hot Air Balloon at the "La Ferme du Ciel," Laruscade

Although traditionally used to protect the donkeys from pests and the salt, today it's mostly to delight children, who can ride them in Parc de la Barbette near Saint-Martin de Ré port. Cordouan Lighthouse

• boat leaves from Le Verdon-Sur-Mer, 50 minutes from Château de Cordeillan-Bages The oldest French lighthouse still in use, first listed as a historical monument in 1862, this 68-meter-tall building is an architectural feat and boasts an interior that has earned it the nickname "the Versailles of the Sea." Cordouan is a must-see for two more reasons: it's a World Heritage Site candidate, and the chances to visit a working lighthouse are increasingly rare.



The Marché des Capucins

15-minute drive from Le Saint-James

Conclude a wild night out or begin an exhaustive tour of Bordeaux with a stroll through the food stalls of the Marché des Capucins, open Tuesday through Sunday. The Île de Ré Méharis


10-minute drive from Hôtel de Toiras - Villa Clarisse

Since its inception, the Itsas Arima association has monitored marine mammal populations on the Basque and Landes coasts, given the threats posed by environmental issues and human influence. To raise awareness of these problems and to mix purpose with pleasure, Itsas Arima offers boat trips to the Gouf de Capbreton. This is an ideal place to observe sea-dwelling mammals, which are only rarely seen along these coastlines. Lunch is served on board and the boat returns to the dock at the end of the day. Be sure to book in advance to avoid missing out on this special day.



58-minute drive from Le Suguet, Sébastien Bras





2-minute walk from La Bastide





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
